Net Control Script

Good morning! This is **NAME & CALL** transmitting from **LOCATION**.

Today is <u>DAY, DATE</u> and today, I'll be your net control operator for today's Health and Wellness net, hosted by the Lake Washington Ham Club. This net runs every morning at 11AM to provide a daily check-in for our members and other hams who can reach us.

The Lake Washington Ham Club has 4 linked repeaters, located on Rose Hill in Kirkland. They are on the 6m, 2m, 1.25m and 70cm bands. You can also connect to us via All-Star or Echo Link. All the details you need to know to reach us are published online at lakewashingtonhamclub.org.

This is a directed net, so all calls will come through me. This net is open to all stations holding a valid Amateur Radio License. We love hearing from new folks. You will find lots of friends and Elmers on this net. Please let me know if this is your first check-in on this net.

When I ask for traffic, please check in one at a time with your call sign and name. Please speak slowly and phonetically, as I am logging each entry. Please avoid tailgating. Once I have logged several callsigns, I'll return to each one to give a report, and then I'll build new rounds of checkins thereafter. Before keying up and giving your report, please wait for the repeater to drop the carrier. You'll hear the courtesy tones, then two seconds later, you'll hear the carrier drop. I'll demonstrate this now.

*** When you give your report, please limit the length of your report to three-minute segments, as that is when our repeaters time out and go quiet. You can watch how long you have been transmitting by going to our website, lakewashingtonhamclub.org, clicking on our Repeaters Page, and scrolling down to the Realtime Monitor.

Today, our optional Question of the Day will be:

I am ready to start the first round of check-ins, so please come ahead now with your callsign and name.
